Success stories from Green Guide Pilots and Registrants

#### The University of Texas School of Nursing and Student Community Center sees Integrated Design as the key to green design

The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston made a commitment early on to develop a green building using an integrated design process. Integrated design requires that project development and implementation occur in a collaborative atmosphere, rather than the traditional linear progress.

UTHSC initiated the process by including integrated design in the Top Seven Guiding Principles of Sustainable Design, which now act as the framework for all UTHSC construction projects. UT Facilities personnel and the architects, BNIM Architects in collaboration with Lake/Flato Architects, convened an integrated design team, including representatives from the owner, architect, mechanical engineer, and contractor. This group worked together throughout the design process with an eye towards balancing environmental, economic, and social interests. The integrated design team's coordinated efforts across building orientation, building massing, glazing and shading design, daylighting, operable windows, and conventional mechanical systems resulted in significant, building-wide energy savings.
